Our country with its unspoiled natural beauties, rich cultural heritage and many other attractions is the ideal holiday destination for our brothers and sisters from the member countries. There are 128 holiday establishments with an overall bed capacity of nearly 20 thousand. According to our statistics close to 720,000 tourists visited our country last year.

We are also encouraging foreign investment to our country which is one of the primary pillars of our development policy. I would like to take this opportunity to invite investors from the member countries to the Turkish Cypriot State to learn more about the investment opportunities in our country and the incentives offered by our Government.

Investment opportunities exist especially in the tourism sector. Hotels and conference tourism, special interest tourism like yacht tourism and marina construction are just a few of the investment opportunities that await foreign businessmen in our country. In addition to abovementioned fields, newly developing areas such as health tourism and agri-industry are considered as attractive fields of investment for the private sector and for foreign investors.

Consequently, those wishing to invest in the Turkish Cypriot State can be sure of a positive Government attitude. In this connection, our Government is keen to welcome investors from ECO countries. The relevant Ministries and our State Planning Organization and the Cyprus Turkish investment promotion agency would be at the disposal of potential investors and businessmen who would like to learn more about the extensive opportunities and incentives that exist in our country.

Excellencies,  
Mr. Chairman,**

I would like to thank you for giving me the floor to address the 24<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Regional Planning Council (RPC) as the representative of Turkic Council, observer to ECO.

Since it is the second time for our organization to participate at the RPC Meeting I would like to elaborate a little about developments within our organization which took place since last year.

As it is known the main emphasis of cooperation between our member states is directed towards economic cooperation. Besides regular meetings of experts and heads of customs, transport and economy ministries which have been held to utilize and activate economic potential of its members to the full cooperation in the field of culture and education, as well as collaboration among Diasporas and universities demonstrate strong commitment of our Member States to closer and vibrant cooperation.

Turkic Council doesn't only promote cooperation among its members but also strongly encourages dialogue and good neighbourly relations with other countries in the region. At the same time establishing and developing relations with other regional and international organizations is among priorities of our organization. Thus, necessary steps have been taken for a closer cooperation with the OIC, OSCE and other specialized international organizations. Moreover, Turkic Council applied for observer status at the UN.

In addition to the MoU, Secretariats will jointly prepare Work Programme encompassing the future practical cooperative activities that would be mutually beneficial.

Finally, participating in the events such as ECO Regional Planning Council as observer will surely help us to learn from the enriched experience of the ECO which has been accumulated throughout years.

In conclusion, I would like to extend my thanks to the ECO for their kind invitation for excellent organization of this event and wish all the success to the Meeting.
